## **Old Testament Reading**

Jeremiah 26:1–15

<sup>1</sup>In the beginning of the reign of Jehoiakim the son of Josiah, king of Judah, this word came from the LORD: <sup>2</sup>"Thus says the LORD: Stand in the court of the LORD's house, and speak to all the cities of Judah that come to worship in the house of the LORD all the words that I command you to speak to them; do not hold back a word. <sup>3</sup>It may be they will listen, and every one turn from his evil way, that I may relent of the

disaster that I intend to do to them because of their evil deeds. <sup>4</sup>You shall say to them, <sup>5</sup>Thus says the LORD: If you will not listen to me, to walk in my law that I have set before you, <sup>5</sup>and to listen to the words of my servants the prophets whom I send to you urgently, though you have not listened, <sup>6</sup>then I will make this house like Shiloh, and I will make this city a curse for all the nations of the earth."

<sup>7</sup>The priests and the prophets and all the people heard Jeremiah speaking these words in the house of the LORD. <sup>8</sup>And when Jeremiah had finished speaking all that the LORD had commanded him to speak to all the people, then the priests and the prophets and all the people laid hold of him, saying, "You shall die! <sup>9</sup>Why have you prophesied in the name of the LORD, saying, 'This house shall be like Shiloh, and this city shall be desolate, without inhabitant'?" And all the people gathered around Jeremiah in the house of the LORD.

<sup>10</sup>When the officials of Judah heard these things, they came up from the king's house to the house of the LORD and took their seat in the entry of the New Gate of the house of the LORD. <sup>11</sup>Then the priests and the prophets said to the officials and to all the people, "This man deserves the sentence of death, because he has prophesied against this city, as you have heard with your own ears."

<sup>12</sup>Then Jeremiah spoke to all the officials and all the people, saying, "The LORD sent me to prophesy against this house and this city all the words you have heard. <sup>13</sup>Now therefore mend your ways and your deeds, and obey the voice of the LORD your God, and the LORD will relent of the disaster that he has pronounced against you. <sup>14</sup>But as for me, behold, I am in your hands. Do with me as seems good and right to you. <sup>15</sup>Only know for certain that if you put me to death, you will bring innocent blood upon yourselves and upon this city and its inhabitants, for in truth the LORD sent me to you to speak all these words in your ears."

Holy Gospel Luke 11:14–28

The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the eleventh chapter.

Glo - ry to You, O Lord.

<sup>14</sup>Now [Jesus] was casting out a demon that was mute. When the demon had gone out, the mute man spoke, and the people marveled. <sup>15</sup>But some of them said, "He casts out demons by Beelzebul, the prince of demons," <sup>16</sup>while others, to test him, kept seeking from him a sign from heaven. <sup>17</sup>But he, knowing their thoughts, said to them, "Every kingdom divided against itself is laid waste, and a divided household falls. <sup>18</sup>And if Satan also is divided against himself, how will his kingdom stand? For you say that I cast out demons by Beelzebul. <sup>19</sup>And if I cast out demons by Beelzebul, by whom do your sons cast them out? Therefore they will be your judges. <sup>20</sup>But if it is by the finger of God that I cast out demons, then the kingdom of God has come upon you. <sup>21</sup>When a strong man, fully armed, guards his own palace, his goods are safe; <sup>22</sup>but when one stronger than he attacks him and overcomes him, he takes away his armor in which he trusted and divides his spoil. <sup>23</sup>Whoever is not with me is against me, and whoever does not gather with me scatters.


<sup>24</sup>"When the unclean spirit has gone out of a person, it passes through waterless places seeking rest, and finding none it says, 'I will return to my house from which I came.' <sup>25</sup>And when it comes, it finds the house swept and put in order. <sup>26</sup>Then it goes and brings seven other spirits more evil than itself, and they enter and dwell there. And the last state of that person is worse than the first."

<sup>27</sup>As he said these things, a woman in the crowd raised her voice and said to him, "Blessed is the womb that bore you, and the breasts at which you nursed!" <sup>28</sup>But he said, "Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and keep it!"






## Service of the Sacrament



#### The Words of Our Lord







OR if you can sew or crochet, she always needs infant size hats and blankets! If someone would like to make blankets, I'm sure we can even get some material donated to do so.

Phil's Friends – A program that is nation-wide that provides support and encouragement for cancer patients. Right now, we are making cards to send to the program coordinator to distribute with the "packet" they send to patients. Please see Charlene Welker to help with these. It consists of coloring a small picture on the front and putting a few words of encouragement inside. There are even instructions available to help you with WHAT to say!

Cards of Caring – The social ministries committee has made a box of cards available in the hallway. They are there to help provide encouragement for those in our own congregation who have been ill, or hospitalized, or home-bound (or just in need of some support). It can get very lonely in those situations and it's very encouraging to hear from your church family. If you don't have time or forget to send a card to someone, these are available. And if you are afraid you'll forget to mail it—there's even a mailbox provided in the hallway that you can "mail" it in. We will gather them each week and mail them for you!

Kelly's Closet — a "boutique" where foster children and their sponsoring families can go to "shop" for clothing that the children may need. Many are placed with a family on an emergency basis and come with only the clothes they have on at the time. Kelly's is a place they can go that makes them feel like they are out shopping for their own clothes/personal item. They let us know when they have a specific need but you can also talk to Charlene Welker if you have questions about other things. They always need "volunteers" if you have a little extra time to help.
