

#### WHAT THE LUTHERAN CHURCH STANDS FOR

THE BIBLE - We believe and teach that the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are in every part the verbally inspired Word of God, who is the Author of the words as well as the thoughts of Scripture; that the Bible is the only rule of faith and life. 2 Peter 1:21; 2 Tim. 3:15-17; I Cor. 2:13; Ps. 119:105; Luke 11:28.

GOD - We believe that God is one divine essence in three persons - Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. Deut. 6:4; Numbers 6:24-26; Matt. 28:19; I John 5:7-8.

<u>MAN</u> - We believe that man is not the product of evolutionary development, but was created in the beginning an intelligent and moral being consisting of body and soul; that man was created holy and innocent, but in his present fall state is entirely depraved and enslaved in the service of sin. Gen. 1:27; Isaiah 64:6.

SIN - We believe that sin is a transgression of the divine Law, and that man is subject to death and eternal

damnation by reason of the guilt that attaches to sin. I John 3:4; Matt. 25:46; Romans 6:23.

REDEMPTION - We believe that God, in His infinite mercy, resolved to save mankind, and that the divine Redeemer appeared in Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Mary and the Son of God, Who perfectly obeyed the Law of God which man had transgressed, by His sufferings and death paid the penalty for the guilt of the entire world, and by His resurrection from the dead has been declared the all-sufficient divine Redeemer. John 1:1; 3:16; Galatians 4:4-5.

JUSTIFICATION BY FAITH - We believe that the question:
"What must I do to be saved," is clearly answered by the
Gospel, which directs the inquirer solely to Christ, "BEHOLD THE LAMB OF GOD THAT TAKETH AWAY THE SIN OF THE
WORLD." John 1:29. "THE BLOOD OF JESUS CHRIST, HIS SON,
CLEANSETH US FROM ALL SIN." I John 1:7. "FOR GOD SO
LOVED THE WORLD THAT HE GAVE HIS ONLY BEGOTTEN SON, THAT
WHOSOEVER BELIEVETH IN HIM SHOULD NOT PERISH, BUT HAVE
EVERLASTING LIFE." John 3:16. "THEREFORE WE CONCLUDE
THAT A MAN IS JUSTIFIED BY FAITH WITHOUT THE DEEDS OF THE
LAW." Romans 3:28. Accordingly, we believe that all who
penitently accept Christ as the one and only Savior in
sincere faith are justified in the sight of God, and made
heirs of salvation. Romans 8:28-38.

THE CHURCH - We believe that all who accept in true faith the forgiveness of sins bought by Christ's atonement on the Cross are members of the Church of Christ, which is an invisible Church, since man cannot determine which of those who profess this faith are true Christians at heart. We believe that true Christians are found wherever the Gospel of Christ is preached. We believe that the true Church is the one which adheres in every point to the doctrine of Christ and His Apostles, and retains the administration of the sacraments in their integrity. We believe that no church body, denomination, or sect can rightfully claim to be the "only saving" church outside of which there is no salvation.

THE MEANS OF GRACE - We believe that the Gospel of Christ is the means whereby God offers the salvation of Christ to man, and by which the Holy Ghost works faith in Christ Jesus. I Corinthians 12:3. We believe that the Sacrament of Baptism, when administered according to the command of Christ to infants and adults, is a means of grace which offers, conveys, and seals the grace of God and the forgiveness of sins. Matt. 28:18-20; Acts 2:38-39; Mark 16:16; I Peter 3:21.

We believe that in the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper the communicants receive in, with, and under the bread and wine the true body and blood of Jesus Christ, and that all believing communicants share in the forgiveness of sins won by Christ's sacrifice of Himself on the cross. Matt. 26:26-28; Mark 14:22-24; Luke 22:19-20; I Cor. 11:23-25.

THE RESURRECTION - We believe that on the Last Day the dead will arise, their souls being clothed in the bodies which they possessed in the present life. Job 19:26-27; John 5:28-29.

THE JUDGMENT - We believe that on the Last Day, Christ will receive into His glory His invisible Church, including all who had died in the faith, and will pronounce the eternal doom upon all who refused to accept Him in this life as their Redeemer. Matt. 25:31-46; I Cor. 15:1-58.
